Meet with a Readmission Counselor: Priority is given to students who read the Understanding Academic Disqualification webpage and complete the Reinstatement Planning Worksheet (see reverse); send an email to readmission@csueastbay.edu to request an appointment and-attach-an-image-of-the-completed-worksheet.

Repeat classes for Grade Forgiveness: Enroll in classes at CSUEB via Open University
