**For the ASSOCIATE DEGREE & GENERAL EDUCATION CERTIFICATION**

**With emphasis on Transfer Preparation to California State University (CSU)**

Students must complete *either* the CSU General Education (GE) Certification Course Pattern *or* the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) and the major or area of emphasis requirements specified in the program of study for the declared major or area of emphasis to earn an associate's degree. To obtain an associate's degree from Copper Mountain College (CMC), at least 12 units must be earned at CMC with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 (**for all grades earned in lower division courses at all colleges and universities attended**) as well as in the selected major or area of emphasis. Student must earn a "C" grade or better in all classes used for the major or area of emphasis. This includes "restricted" electives. It is recommended that you file an "Intent to Graduate" form & Intent to Earn a CSU GE Certificate form the semester prior to graduation by October 1<sup>st</sup> for Fall and March 1<sup>st</sup> for Spring and Summer. A minimum of 60 transferable units is required to earn a CMC associate's degree. The remaining coursework is upper division and must be completed at the campus granting the bachelor's degree. **Completing an associate's degree does not guarantee admission to a university.**

**Important CSU Information**– The CSU campuses require 60 transferable units. It is imperative that students complete 60 transferable units for the following reasons: 1. You will have junior status; 2. You will have a better financial package as a junior; 3. You will have priority r
