1. Transferring to the CSU system consists of reaching junior status by completing 60 transferable units with a minimum 2.0 GPA, including major requirements, general education, and/or electives. A maximum of 70 CSU-transferable units are applied to the bachelor's degree after transfer.
2. To be eligible to transfer to a CSU, students must complete Areas A1, A2, A3, and B4 with a grade of C- or higher in each course.
3. CSU general education certification requires completion of all requirements in Areas A through F, approximately 39 units.
4. A course can be used only once to fulfill an Area A through F requirement.
5. Students whose majors require more than 30 units are encouraged to meet with a counselor regarding the advisability of completing all major requirements instead of all general education requirements.

7. Area F and reduced units in Area D are new requirements for students who begin college Fall 2021 and later. Continuing students who began college prior to Fall 2021 and maintained catalog rights may complete previous CSU GE requirements. See counselor for details.
