Charlotte's Web, E.B. White's heart-wrenching story of love and friendship, will be Cal State East Bay's spring family theatre production with performances on Friday, May 4 at 8 p.m., and Saturday, May 5 at 2 and 8 p.m.

All shows will be held in the University Theatre on the Hayward campus of Cal State East Bay, 25800 Carlos Bee Blvd. Tickets are on sale for \$7 for general admission, \$6 for youth and seniors, \$5 for CSUEB students, \$3 for children, and \$16 for a family of up to two adults and two children. A. Fajilan will be director of the show that features a cast of humans ranging in age from "6-ish to 60-ish." The production also includes puppets of all sizes.
